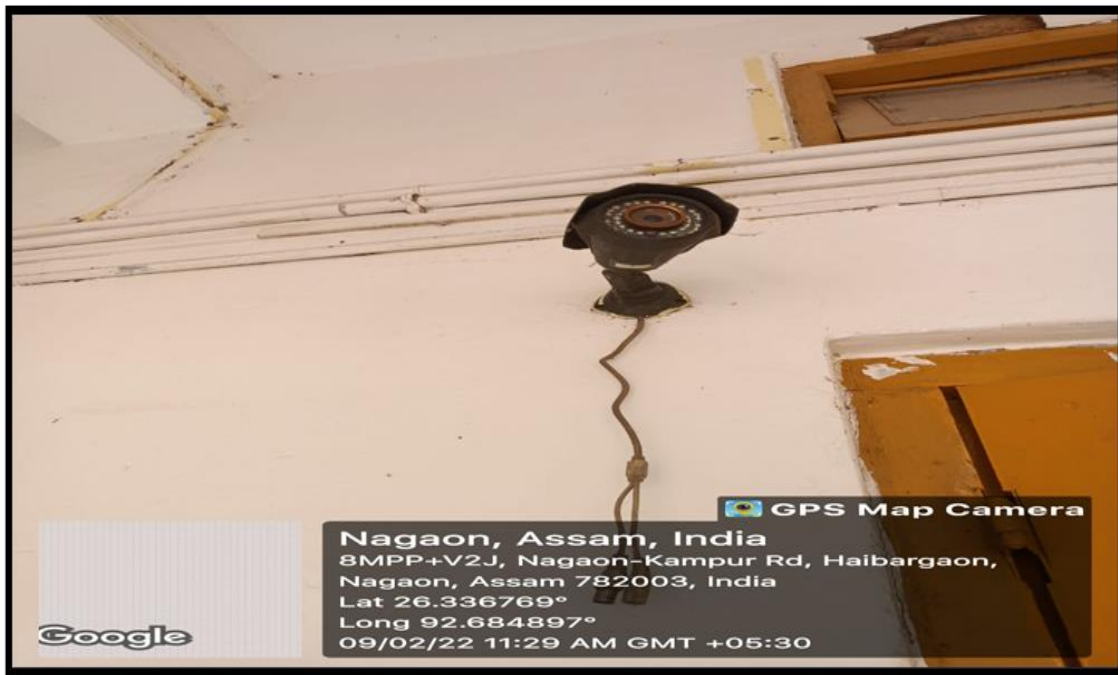


Figure 2. CCTV at different locations of the Campus

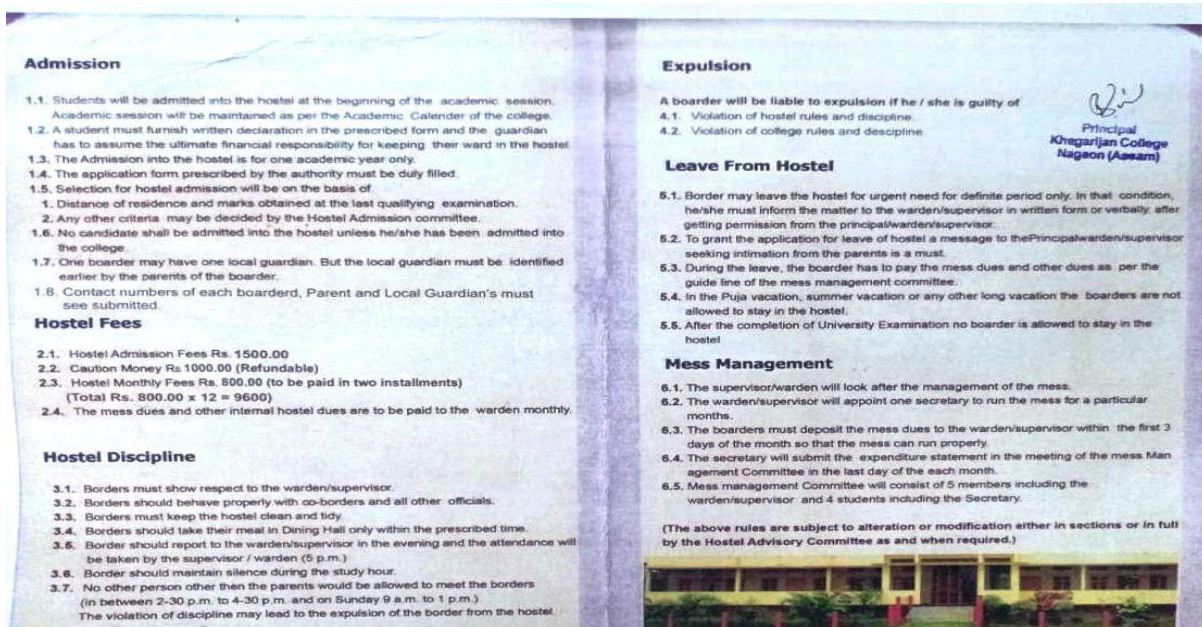


Figure 7. Rules and Regulations of Girls' Hostel

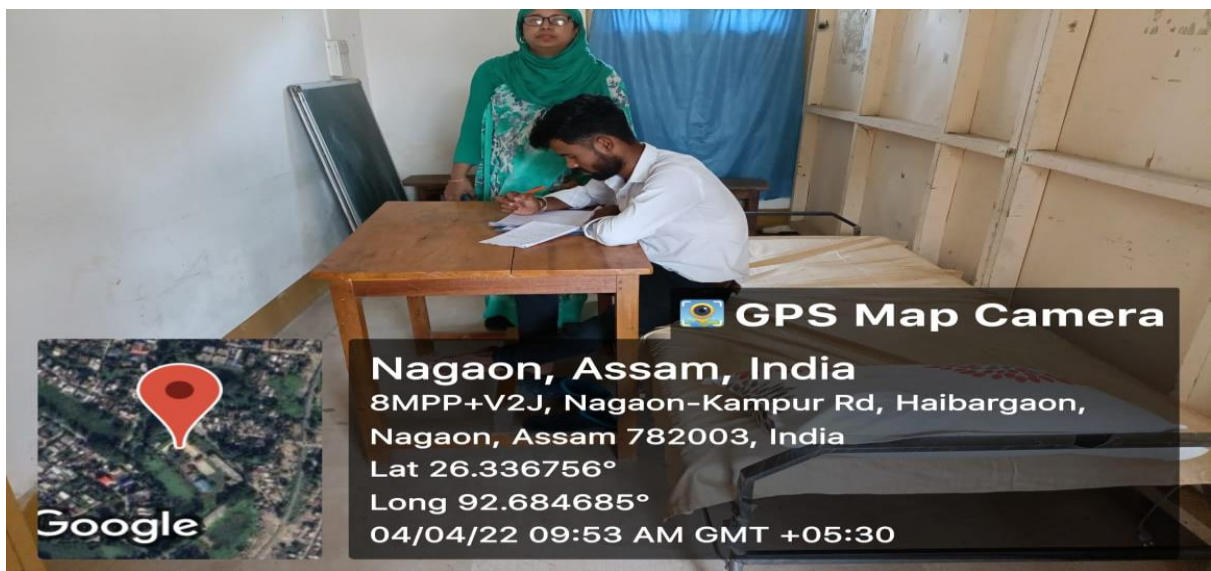


Figure 12. Medical Health Facilities at the campus
